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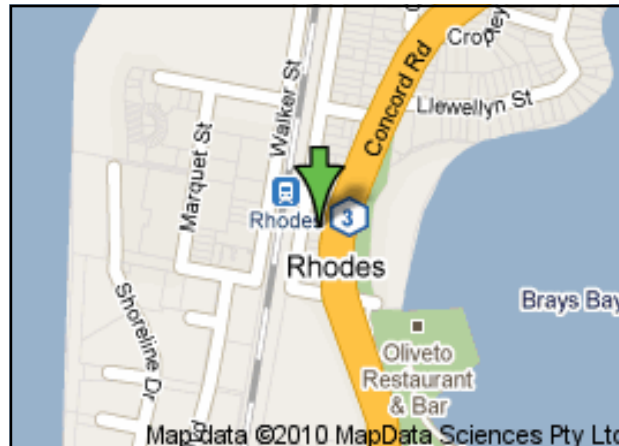

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WHAT IS GROUP SUPERVISION?

Group Supervision is a group program run by The Salvation Army Counselling Service in Rhodes. The aim of this program is to provide support and assistance to counsellors, at an affordable cost.

WHAT WE DO

The purpose of this group is to give counsellors the opportunity to gain further knowledge, skills and support, as well as to assist in maintaining their ethical and professional standards. Group supervision sessions also meet the requirements of many counsellor training courses.

We provide a place of growth for counsellors in a safe environment, and where appropriate an opportunity for them to be challenged in a positive and respectful way.

Confidentiality and privacy is maintained at all times.

HOW BIG IS THE GROUP?

There is a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 6 supervisees in a group.

SUPERVISOR

The group will be led by a professional Counsellor who is also a qualified supervisor. She is committed to giving

OUR OBJECTIVES

- To journey together and encourage supervisees to work more effectively and creatively with their clients
- To explore different ways in working with difficult clients
- To deal with clients, who have experienced trauma, abuse or mental disorder
- To explore ways in working and managing Domestic Violence cases
- To encourage and promote different levels of reflection and create awareness of supervisees' work through constructive feedback that facilitates change for supervisees, which will be of benefit to their clients
- To help supervisees think systemically and stay focused with their work
- To help supervisees develop ethical maturity

APPROACH

A variety of verbal, creative and experiential approaches will be used throughout the supervisory process.

- Verbal—through dialogue.
- Creative—sandplay, symbols, pillows, art, etc.
- Experiential—role plays, etc.

Group:

The group will meet on a monthly basis, for a 2 hour session. There will be a total of 10 sessions in a calendar year. It is anticipated that the group will commence in Oct 2011.

Cost:
