MAJOR DARYL CROWDEN

The Salvation Army Overseas Development Consultant and Preston Corps Officer in Melbourne. He led responses to the 2009 Victorian Bushfires, the tsunamis in Sri Lanka and India, and refugees in Rwanda. He will address the interplay of responders, survivors, and counsellor roles in complex emergencies.

PATRICK NEWTON

A clinical and forensic psychologist in private practice, treats offenders and others relating to our legal system. He coordinated the Grad Dip in counselling at LaTrobe University and counselled people with mental illness and drug dependence. He illuminates trauma perpetrators, survivors and the systems around them.



MERYL LEE

CCAA, a trauma therapist in private practice, designed "Freeing Me" retreats and groups for adult survivors of childhood abuse and lectured in trauma at Tabor College. She developed an integrated therapeutic model that addresses both adult and developmental trauma and applies current neuroscientific research.

GENEVIEVE MILNES

CCAA national president, educator, and clinical psychologist in Perth, combined her disciplines to create a short-term psychotherapeutic model. Research shows that adolescent and adult brains can be re-wired. Her model achieves re-wiring for those suffering suicidal ideation and depression.



DR. JOHN STEWARD

A spiritual director, managed community development training for World Vision in Indonesia, Australia, and Rwanda, and with learners from 50+ countries. He mentors Rwandans who coordinate healing and peace-building programs. He also uses their approach in Indonesia and with a range of Australians.
